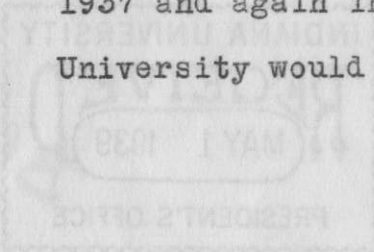

Dear President Wells:

In the year 1936, Sigma Alpha Mu Fraternity undertook to bring to this country promising students who had been prevented from continuing their studies owing to the religious persecution in Germany. President William Lowe Bryan promised that Indiana University would omit the fees of a refugee student to whom our Chapter would offer free room and board. Under this arrangement, Henry H. Remak of Berlin, Germany, a student of modern languages, came to this campus in September, 1936. He received the A. M. degree in 1937 from Indiana University. Since then, he has done some tutoring while preparing for the Ph. D. degree he hopes to obtain in the near future. Owing to his excellent work (he has maintained a A- average ever since he came here), Indiana University extended his scholarship in 1937 and again in 1938. We would highly appreciate it if Indiana University would continue to omit his fees for 1939/40.

Under this arrangement, Henry E. Koser of Berlin, Germany, a student of modern languages, came to this country in September, 1938. He received his A. B. degree in 1937 from Indiana University. Since then, he has done some excellent work while studying for his Ph. D. degree in hopes to obtain it the next fall. Owing to his excellent work (he has maintained a 4.0 average over three years here), Indiana University has advanced his scholarship in the same year. We would highly appreciate it if Indiana University would grant him his fees for 1939/40.

May 9, 1938 -- Board of Trustees

President Wells presented a letter from the local chapter of the Sigma Alpha Mu fraternity requesting that the University remit the contingent fees of Henry Remak, a German refugee student, for the school year 1938-39. He stated that these fees had been remitted for the past two years at the request of the National Student Federation of America, also that the Sigma Alpha Mu fraternity had defrayed the living expenses of Mr. Remak during this time and is willing to continue to do so during the coming year.

On motion of Mr. Nolan, seconded by Mr. Rabb, the Board concurred in the recommendation of President Wells that the fees of Mr. Remak for the school year 1938-39 be remitted.
