President William Lowe Bryan promised that Indiana University would omit the fees of a refugee student to whom our Chapter would offer free room and board. Under this arrangement. Henry H. Remak of Berlin, Germany. a student of modern languages, came to this campus in September, 1936. He received the A. M. degree in 1937 from Indiana University. Since then, he has done some tutoring while preparing for the Ph. D. degree he hopes to obtain in the near future. Owing to his excellent work (he has maintained a A- average ever since he came here). Indiana University extended his scholarship in 1937 and again in 1938. We would highly appreciate it if Indiana University would continue to omit his fees for 1939/40.
